-REGISTRATION: open to new families after April 24. All applications due by the closing date of July 15.

It is your responsibility to contact us to be added to the list each school year. Admittance to CCA is determined by the Leadership team.

CCA Mission Statement

CCA, a ministry of St. Paul's Presbyterian Church, exists to provide a community for Homeschool families and to create both an academic and godly environment that serves to supplement and support the academic endeavors happening in the home.

Goals:

-Students are challenged to improve their ability to appropriately interact socially with teachers and other children in a classroom setting. Examples: sitting in class, raising hands, serving others, waiting their turn, listening attentively, walking quietly in the halls, being courteous, etc.

-Students will improve their skills to perform or present in front of a group. Example: speech/choir.

-Students will be challenged academically (or physically in gym class) in an age-appropriate manner. Example: science information, memorization, writing, speaking, etc.

-Students are encouraged to create and foster growing friendships with other children.

-Parents/guardians will have the opportunity to build friendships and be supported by each other. This might include exchanging ideas, asking for support, or comparing and sharing teaching/learning techniques and styles.

CCA Basics

-CCA meets for 2 semesters on Wednesdays from 9:10am-2pm with a 30 minute lunch at 12:30pm. The first semester is 12 weeks starting in mid September and ending mid December. CCA does *not* meet in January.

The second semester is 12 weeks starting the first Wednesday in February and ending mid April.

-Students wear uniforms (primary-high school, nursery not included). Students wear khaki/black/navy pants or modest shorts/skirts/jumper paired with a long or short sleeved polo shirt (choose from white/yellow/light blue or navy blue). Sneakers are recommended for gym class.

-A parent or guardian **MUST** stay in the building for the duration of the CCA day. Exceptions include leaving for an *occassional* reason, in which case, a substitute guardian must be assigned to the child.

-Nursery is available to drop off babies and toddlers under age 4 *when their parent/gardian is occupied in a classroom (teaching, co-teaching, helping, or volunteering)* Parents are to pick up their children immediately after or stay and help in the nursery when they are not in the classroom.

-The class schedule each year is determined based on interest and availibility from teachers and students. It remains similar each year with changes made on a semester by semester basis.

-A detailed schedule of classes will be provided before classes begin.

-All parents/guardians are required to help at CCA in some capacity. This may include teaching, co-teaching, helping in a classroom, or volunteering. Please inquire about how we can best plug you in at CCA. CCA exists and operates because our parents/guardians make it happen every week. We could not do it without you!

-Compensation is available to teachers, co-teachers, and classroom helpers.

-All families are required to read, sign, and agree to the Student Handbook rules and regulations.
